

PPSL Meeting re Helensburgh Waterfront Development

18/01614/PP

19th December 2018

Helensburgh Community Council objects to the proposals for the area nearest to West Clyde Street (in other words the white area on the map).

1. The Proposals.

- 1.1. It is understood that much of the white area is being earmarked for future retail units. Given the likely opposition to these from the Helensburgh and Lomond Chamber of Commerce, no date has been given for the construction of these units, if indeed they will happen at all.
- 1.2. In the meantime the area is to have a surface of Type I Aggregate. The Internet states that Type I Aggregate "is a must for high quality paths and is [the] most commonly used granular sub base for building paths." The photo which is attached shows Type 1 Aggregate, and in particular attention should be paid to the 50p piece which is included in the photo. It is important to note that Type 1 Aggregate is a base over which some other material has to be laid in order to protect it from the weather. Importantly, it is not a long-term solution, and probably not even a medium term solution.
- 1.3. It is also understood that the white area (or at least most of it) will be surrounded by some form of hoarding.

2. The Grounds for Objection.

- 2.1. No timescale is given to show how long the white area will be left in the proposed condition.
- 2.2. It is unacceptable that the white area should be finished with Type I Aggregate which is a material for use as a sub base and NOT for use as a top surface.
- 2.3. Over time Type 1 Aggregate is likely to break down due to the prevailing weather and spread over surrounding areas as an unsightly mess, unless regularly cleared (at a cost).
- 2.4 It will also be unacceptable to the people of Helensburgh that the white area might be left unfinished and/or surrounded by hoarding.
- 2.5. A key objective for the development of the new leisure centre is that it will encourage more people to come to the town, thus boosting business. It is extremely likely that leaving the white area in the condition described above may well achieve the opposite and discourage people from coming to the town.

If the proposal as set out above is allowed to go ahead, the likely reaction of the people of Helensburgh when they see it will be "what on earth were Argyll and Bute Council thinking about when they allowed this area to be left in this state."

3. Suggested Motions for the PPSL Committee Meeting.

3.1. That the plan for the leisure centre be accepted subject to the condition that detailed proposals for the white area are brought forward within 6 months for the consideration of the PPSL Committee; or 3.2. That consideration of the total plan for the leisure centre be continued for another month so that

detailed proposals for the white area may be produced.
